What a truly wonderful program year we've had! I am so thankful for you all for making this program possible. We will finish out June with our current ongoing classes. The k-5th class will finish up with their CartUUns lesson plan and the youth group will continue with their youth led discussions. For July the youth group will have one big outing or get together; we're still working out the details of the where and when, but we will let you know as soon

as we do! As far as classes go we will be combining all classes into one, though this class will be outside! With our big move coming up we wanted to guide the children in creating keepsakes from the wetlands and labyrinth to take with them. For the youth group, we are inviting them to take pictures to document our time at the fellowship. We will provide them with disposable cameras to capture what is important to them at the fellowship, and put them all together in a scrap book for all to enjoy.

I know that there are a lot of mixed feelings about our move coming up. For myself included! Even as someone who is very excited about the move, and what it will bring, and the challenge of practicing our faith as a people of change. I am looking forward to seeing the good in the move, but every time I come to the building I notice a new little thing that I will miss. I will miss the labyrinth, which I have walked many, many, many times. I will miss our playground that I have the honor of watching not only my children, but all of our children find joy in. While I'll miss these things and cherish them while we are able, they seem small in the bigger picture of what we'll be taking with us. We will be taking with us the thing that is most important to our faith, our community. During neighboring faiths when I was in high school, we visited a church service that ended up being about raising money to expand their already enormous building. Throughout the entire service, the Pastor repeatedly said "It's not about the building!" though it was very clearly, a service, all about their building. My friend who was in the class with me, took that sentence and used it as often as he could, to the point that I would have been happy never to hear those words, strung together in that exact way ever again. But 15 years later, thinking about this move, and the friendships I've made and experiences I've had over the years in this space, it seems to fit the most. "It's not about the building." That friend I found in RE as a youth is still one of my closest friends to this day, even while we live 500 miles apart. So it was never about the building. I am ready for our next adventure together, and to see what amazing things we can do as a community.

RULES FOR CHILDREN IN THE WORSHIP SERVICE

One. If you find that you're sitting in front of a child and they can't see, try leaning to the side.

Two. If the children seated behind you are rustling papers, hand them a few crayons.

Three. If there is a baby that is crying, offer to take the baby from their parent and walk to the back of the church and rock the child for a while. The parent really needs a break.

Four. If the teenagers are whispering give them some Smarties. The rustling and crinkling will replace their whispering.

Five. If an adult complains to an usher about the noisy children near them, offer to trade seats with that adult and then apologize to the parents of the children.

Six. When a child is running around giving everyone high-fives during greeting your neighbor make sure to give them an extra fun high-five, and then high-five the next five adults you see.

Seven. If a child has worn tap shoes to church and is dancing on the wood portion of the floor, slip the sheet music for *The Entertainer* to the pianist and roll with it.

Eight. When children can't hear due to an adult wearing a squeaky puffy jacket, offer to assist them in removing it and hang it up.

Nine. When the three-year-old insists on standing on the front pew turned backwards facing the congregation, give them a pair of very dark glasses. That will prevent the child from catching any adult's eye, which may lead to distracting the adult.

Ten. When a child in front of you is very squirmy, and then they finally turn around, take it in stride and play Got Your Nose until he turns to the front again. —adapted from a post by CB Beal, *Justice and Peace Consulting*
